Writing in Year 6 begins with consolidation of Key objectives from previous year groups, to ensure these are embedded prior to learning, applying and then consolidating Year 6 writing objectives. Children in Year 6 spend their time consolidating their understanding of the 4 main purposes of writing. Where punctuation and grammar components are introduced in the outline above, teachers may also choose to adapt the teaching of these and choose to embed some misconceptions that have arisen as part of day-to-day teaching.
