The Journey Starts...

The children acquire knowledge about the past, being able to discuss what has happened in the past, being able to talk about events in their own life and that of their family.



Romans

Children will learn that the Roman Empire was in Britain and know that an empire is a group of states or countries that all have the same monarch.

Know that an emperor is a type of monarch who rules an empire.



Ancient Greece

Children will learn all about what historical sources tell us about Ancient Greece as well as learning all about the Olympic Games. They will also learn about the Ancient Greek beliefs and what democracy was like.



Anglo Saxons and Vikings

Children will learn all about the Anglo Saxons and explore how they lived. They will then learn about how they impacted upon life in Britain, they will then learn key knowledge about the Vikings and why they raided.

Early Islamic Civilizations

Children will learn that Muhammad was born in 570CE in Mecca and know he founded the religion of Islam in 610CE when he received the first revelations of the Quran.

The children learn all about the roles of a monarch as well as features of a historical building.




When I was a lad
